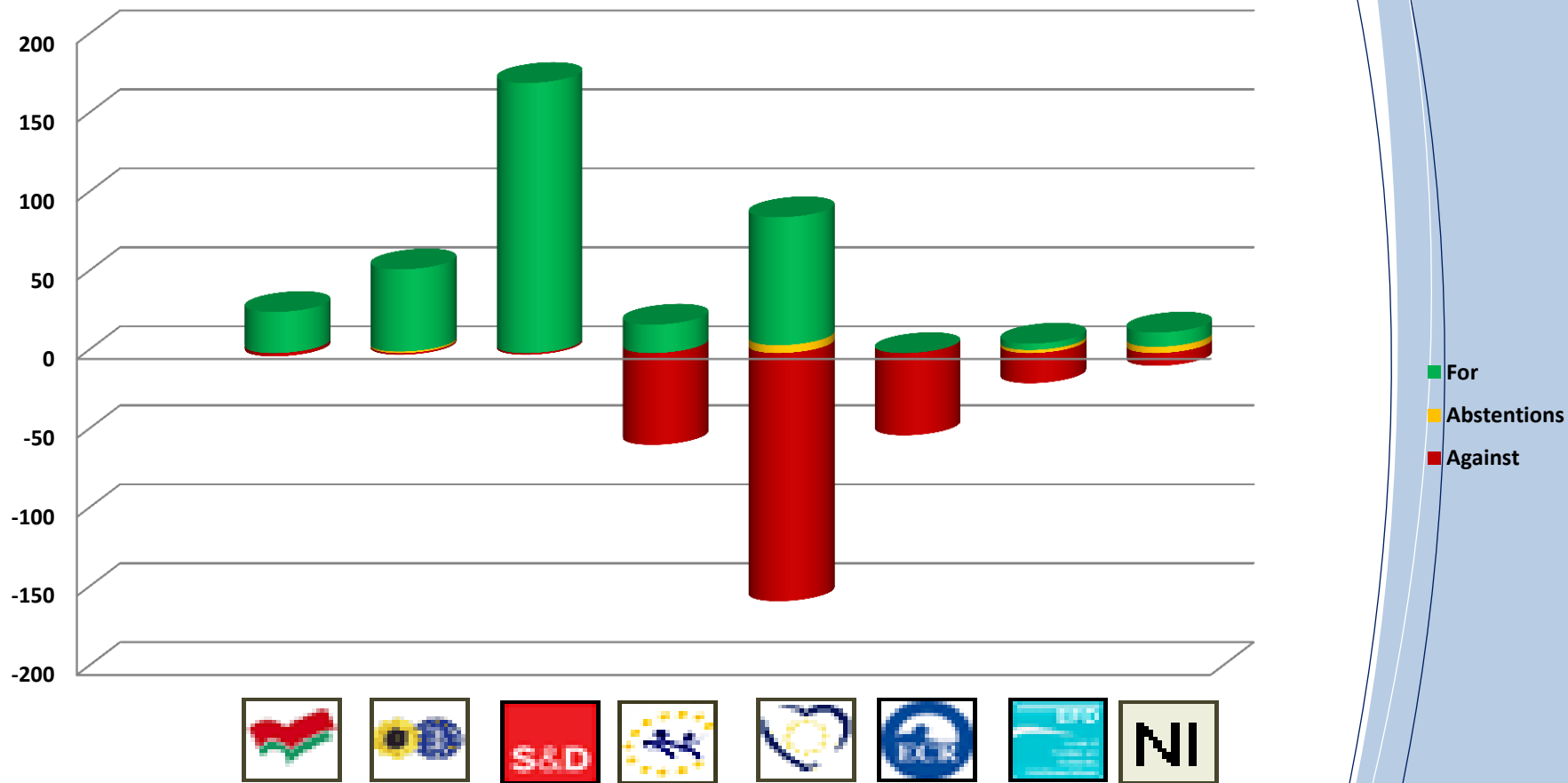

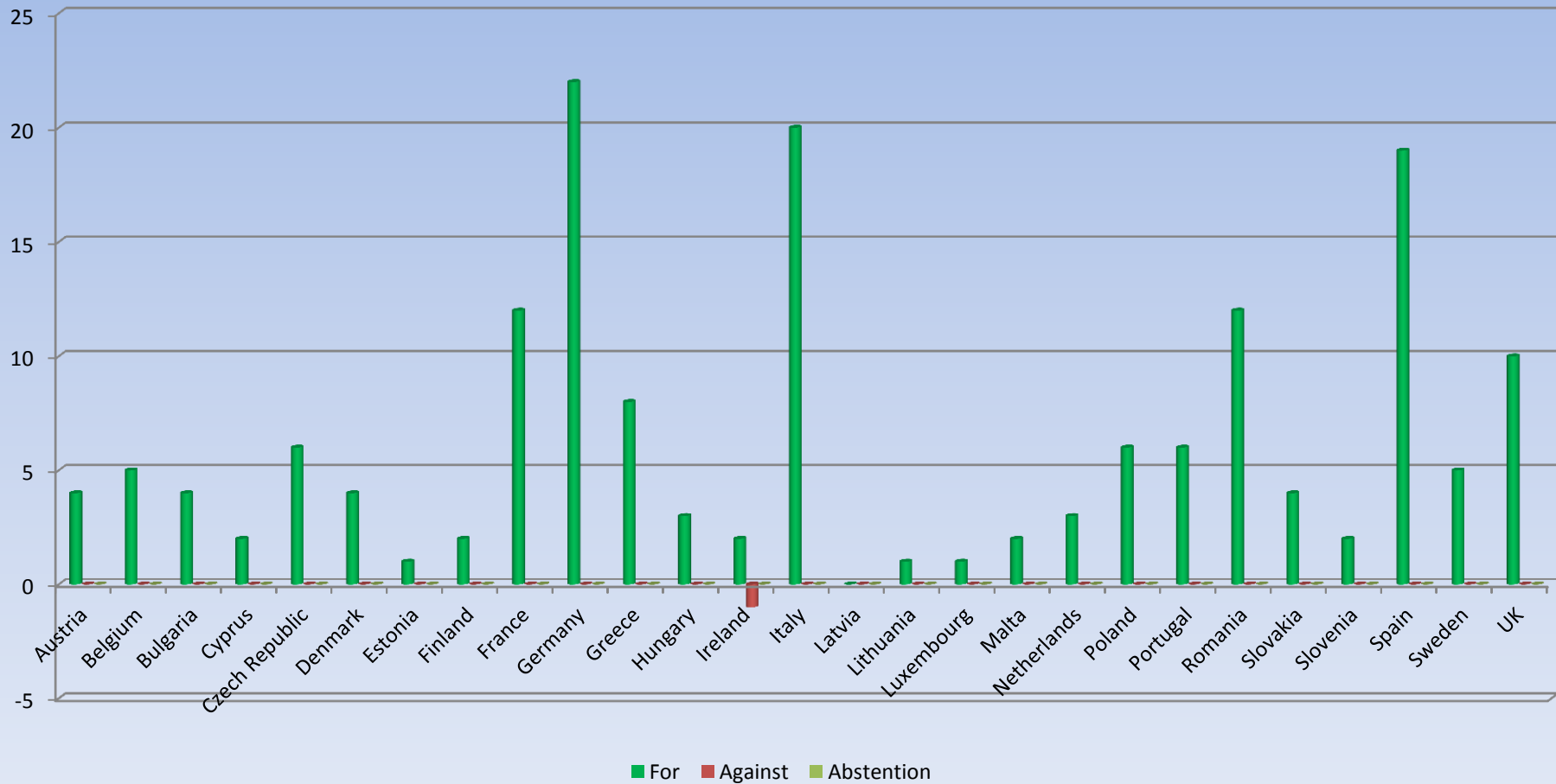

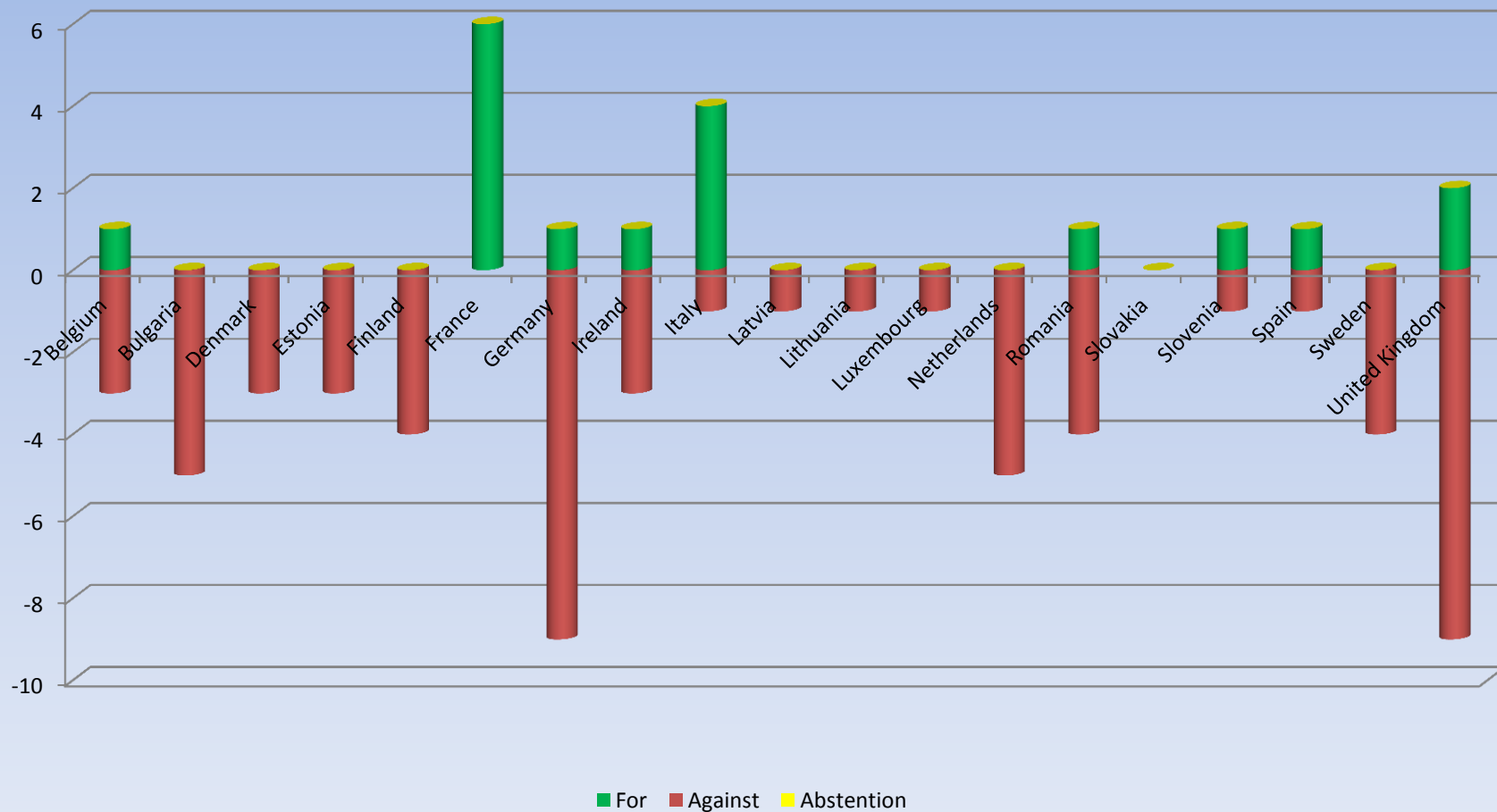
Innovative financing, am 2, p. 16 Distribution of votes inside the EPP

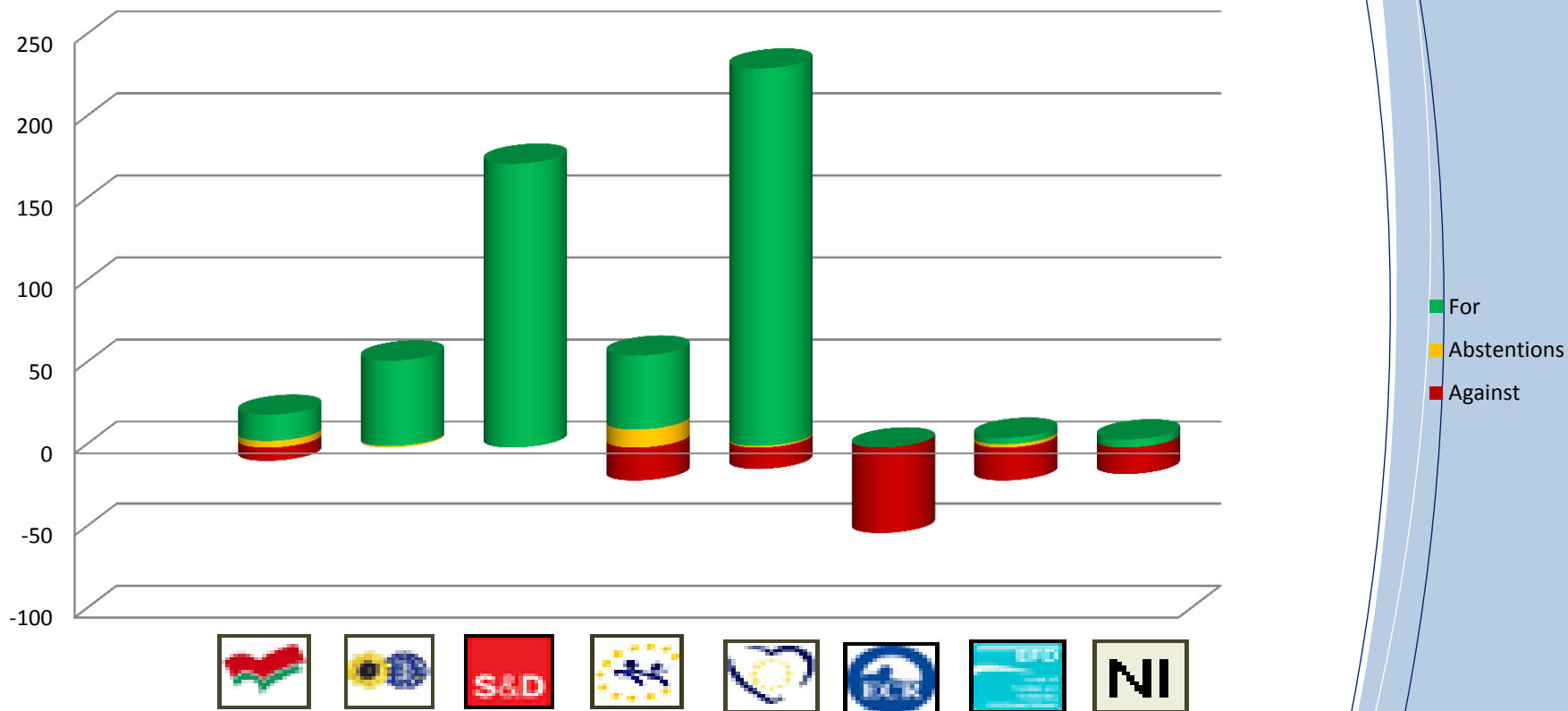

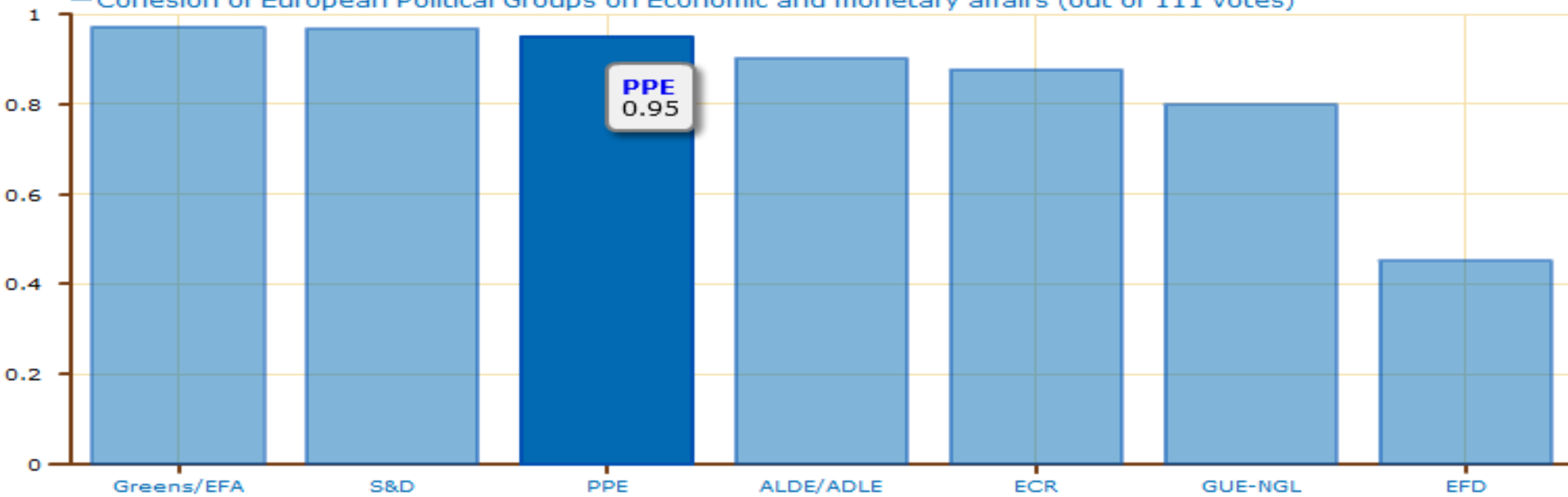

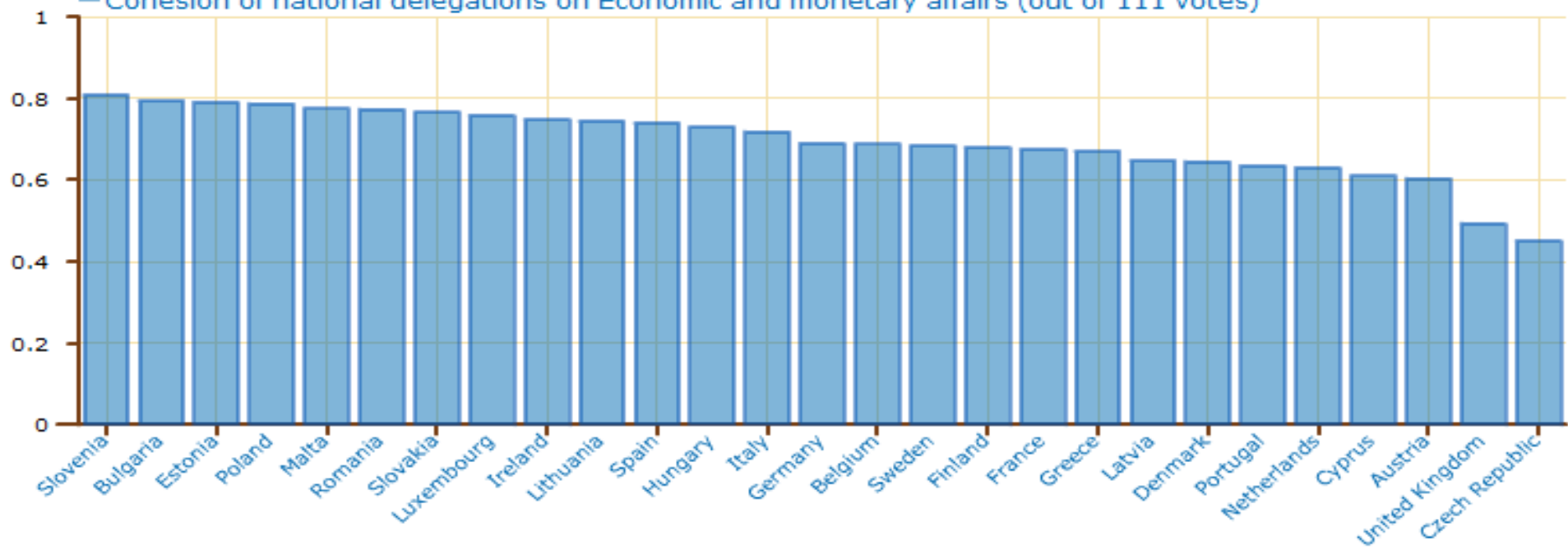

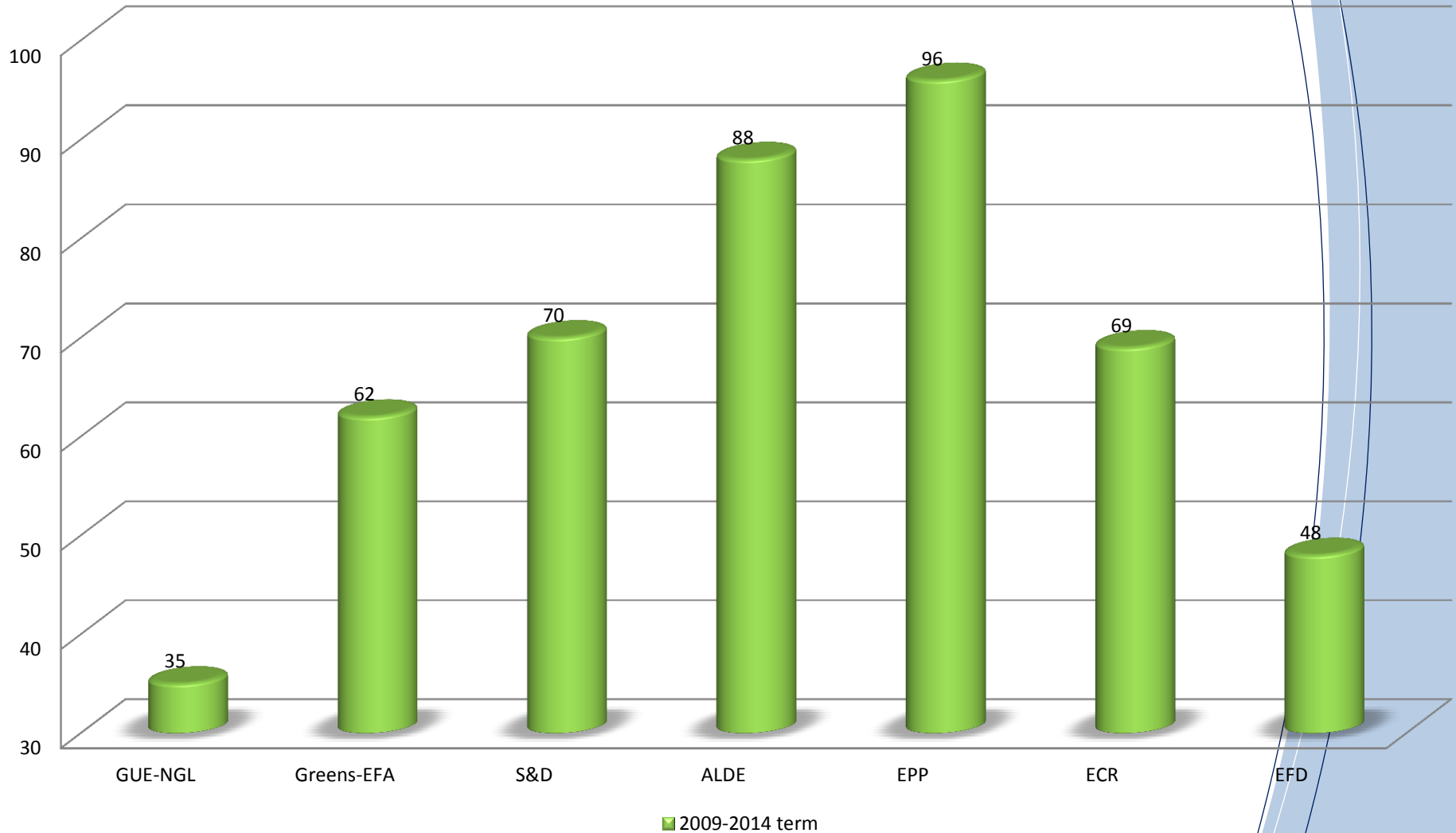
— Cohesion of European Political Groups on Economic and monetary affairs (out of 111 votes)
